INTRODUCTION

Raipur Institute of Medical Sciences (RIMS) stands as one of Chhattisgarh's premier private medical institutions, built on the guiding philosophy of **"Health For All"** — a commitment to accessible, quality healthcare and world-class medical education for the region and beyond.

Establishment & Recognition

- The attached teaching hospital was established in 2012, laying the clinical foundation years before the medical college began admitting students.
- RIMS received its Permission from MCI/NMC in 2016 with 150 seats, formally launching its MBBS programme and marking the institute's entry into medical education.
- The college is affiliated with Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay Memorial Health Sciences and Ayush University, Raipur, and is approved by the National Medical Commission (NMC).
- RIMS currently intakes 250 MBBS seats annually, making it one of the larger private medical college intakes in the state.

Postgraduate (PG) Programmes

RIMS has grown beyond undergraduate training into a full-fledged postgraduate teaching institution:

- **63 PG (MD/MS) seats** distributed across major broad specialities such as General Medicine, General Surgery, Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Pediatrics, Orthopaedics, Anaesthesiology, Radiodiagnosis, Pathology, and other clinical and para-clinical departments
- Structured residency training under experienced faculty, with exposure to high patient volumes across OPD, IPD, and emergency services

Super-Speciality Facilities

Reflecting its growth into a tertiary-care institution, RIMS also offers **super-speciality facilities (Cardiology, CTVS, Neurology, Neurosurgery, Urology, Plastic Surgery, Medical Gastroenterology, Surgical Gastroenterology)** enabling advanced patient care and specialized clinical training beyond broad specialities — giving MBBS and PG students exposure to higher-order diagnostics and treatment pathways typically found only in larger tertiary hospitals.

We have also received permission from the **Government of Chhattisgarh** to establish **DM/MCh super-speciality programmes in four disciplines**, with **Consent of Affiliation (CoA) from the University**, namely **Cardiology, Cardiothoracic & Vascular Surgery (CTVS), Neurosurgery, Plastic Surgery**.

Campus & Infrastructure

Spread across a sprawling campus, RIMS has been designed to give students an integrated environment for learning, clinical exposure, and residential life:

- **Academic Block** – spacious lecture theatres, smart classrooms with digital/AV teaching aids, and dedicated departments for pre-clinical, para-clinical, and clinical subjects
- **Central Library** – extensive collection of textbooks, journals, and digital/e-library resources with reading halls and various National & International Journals.
- **Skill & Simulation Labs** – anatomy, physiology, biochemistry, pathology, microbiology, and clinical skills labs equipped with modern instrumentation and simulation-based training tools
- **Attached Teaching Hospital** – a multi-specialty hospital (running since 2012) offering departments such as General Medicine, Surgery, Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Pediatrics, Orthopaedics, Emergency, Dermatology, ENT, Ophthalmology, Psychiatry and more, giving students hands-on clinical exposure from an early stage
- **High-End Medical Facilities** – ICU and critical care units, trauma and emergency care centre, modern operation theatres, diagnostic imaging (X-ray, CT, ultrasound, MRI, Mammography), Cath Lab, Dialysis, in-house pathology and blood bank services, and a 24x7 ambulance service
- **Hostel Facilities** – separate, secure hostels for boys and girls with mess, recreation, and Wi-Fi-enabled residential blocks
- **Sports & Recreation** – indoor and outdoor sports facilities, gymnasium, and spaces for extracurricular and cultural activities. We have the largest Cricket, Football, Volleyball, Handball, Basketball grounds as per international standards.
- **Auditorium & Seminar Halls** – for conferences, CMEs, guest lectures, and student events
- **Transport Facility** – Vehicle service, including bus, is available for students for travelling to University Examination Centers, Cultural events in other institutes, Medical Camps, RHTC, UHTC, Industrial Visits, Community visits as per Department of Community Medicine academic requirements.

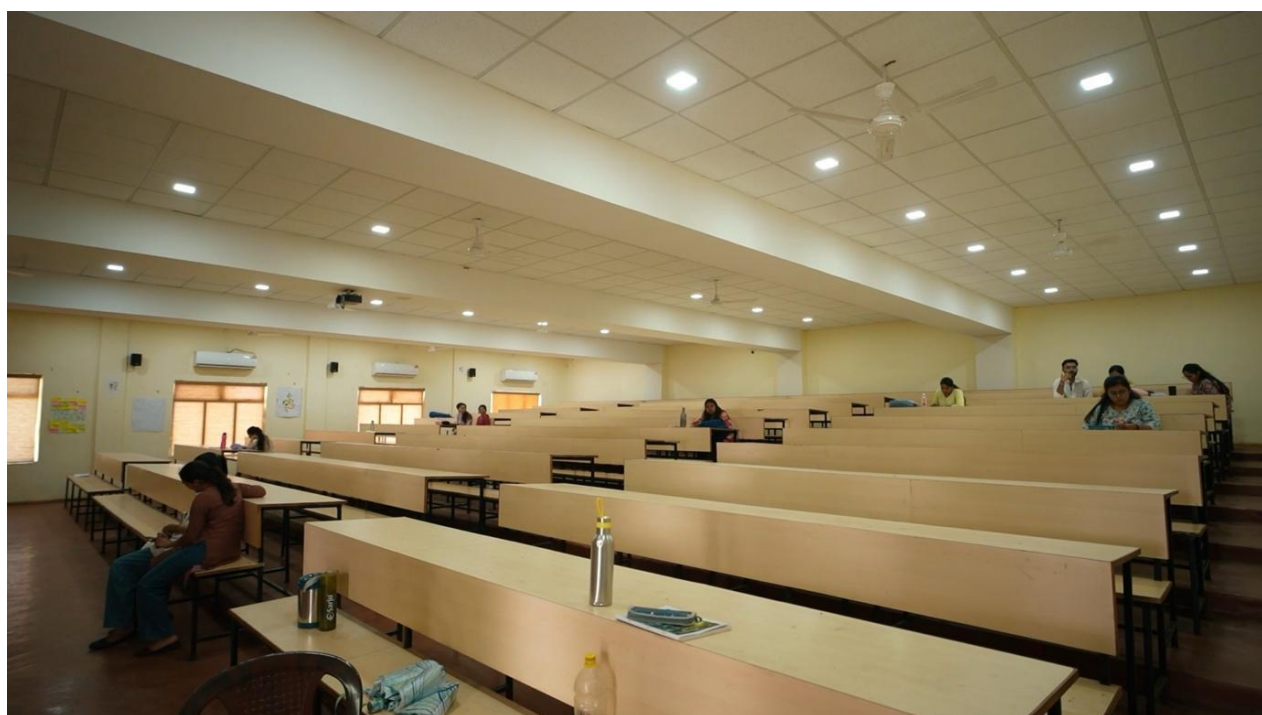

Details of MBBS Course

Duration:

Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) course at RIMS, Raipur shall be for four & half year and one-year compulsory rotatory internship.

Number of Seats and Reservation:

Total of 250 (Two Hundred and Fifty) seats for Indian Nationals are available for admission to MBBS Course at RIMS, Raipur.

Reservation policy as per Government of India is applied and the seat matrix for MBBS Course at RIMS, Raipur is as follows:

S. No.	Category	Seats
1	Government Quota	106
2	Management Quota	106
3	NRI Quota	38
Total		250

50% of the seats will be reserved for the OBC, SC, ST & PwBD categories.

Other Backward Classes Non-Creamy Layer (OBC – NCL) – reservation for OBC – NCL shall be according to the rules of the Government of India. Candidates are required to produce the necessary certificate in the prescribed format clearly mentioning that he / she does not belong to the persons / sections (Creamy Layer).

Scheduled Classes (SC) / Scheduled Tribes (ST) – Reservation for SC / ST will be according to the rules of Government of India. Candidates are required to produce the necessary certificate in the prescribed format as per Government guidelines.

Person with Benchmark Disability (PwBD) – Reservation for PwBD will be in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. Candidates are required to produce the necessary certificate in the prescribed format clearly mentioning that he / she belongs to Persons with Benchmark Disability Category along with percentage of disability. Disability certificate should be issued by a duly constituted and authorized Medical Board of the State or Central Govt. Hospitals / Institutions as mentioned in the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC) Information Bulletin. Specified Disabilities under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 with respect to admission in MBBS Course.

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Attendance:

Attendance at MBBS Course theory & practical classes is compulsory.

All MBBS students must maintain a minimum of **75%** attendance in theory and **80%** attendance in practical classes in each subject individually.

Students failing to fulfil minimum attendance criteria shall be detained in the subject in which he / she is short of attendance and may not be eligible to appear for the final professional examination only in that subject.

Internal Assessment Marks:

Weightage for internal assessment shall be **50%** marks in theory and **50%** marks in practical of the total marks in each subject.

Students must secure **50%** marks of the total marks fixed for internal assessment in a particular subject in order to be eligible to appear in a professional university examination of that subject.

Students failing to secure minimum **50%** marks in Internal assessment shall be detained in the subject in which he / she has secured less than **50%** marks and may not be eligible to appear for the final professional examination only in that subject.

Compulsory Rotatory Internship Training:

After passing the Final MBBS Examination, all students will be required to do Compulsory Internship Training for a period of one calendar year (12 months) in the Hospital and Rural Health Centre's of RIMS, Raipur.

During the Internship Period, the Interns are allowed for a total of 15 days leave in full term of one year (As per CRMI 2021).

The degree of MBBS shall be awarded after satisfactory completion of one-year Rotatory Internship Training.

Hostel Facilities:

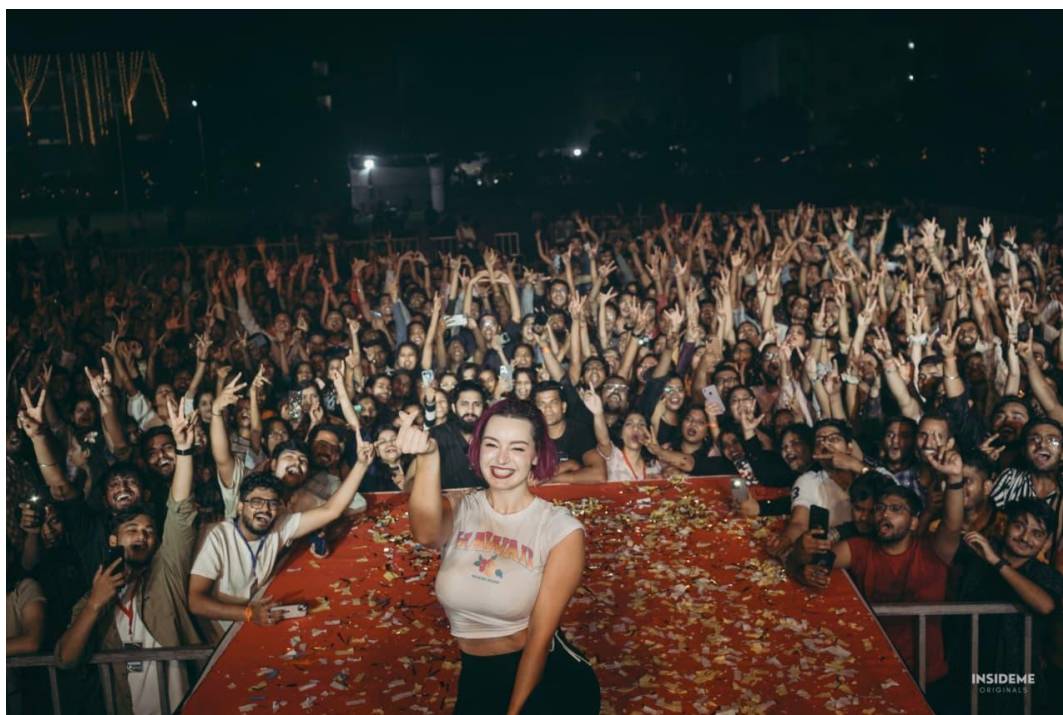
